

#### Dear Friends,

I was late in writing this column this month (apologies to our Executive Director, Cynthia Barzilai!) and, unfortunately, it gives me an opportunity to comment on the latest anti-Semitic attack in this country. I was once told by a history professor of mine, Dr. Leonard Kravitz of the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in New York, that anti-Semitism in the Western world will always



ebb and flow, it will never disappear. In part, this is uncomfortably due to the echoes of ancient tropes in the New Testament that, when read without appropriate commentary and historical context, still damage the image of Jews among some Christians. It was this attitude upon which Hitler capitalized when he conceived of the genocide of the Final Solution. He didn't invent anything new. He gave it a name, a structure and technology.

On the other hand, there are no Christians in my circle of friends and colleagues who adhere to such dark divisiveness. In fact, they are some of the kindest, most universally oriented people I know, literally walking, talking and doing, as they understand Jesus did. I walk beside them in the same protest lines, sing the same songs of love and hope and have the same vision of justice as they do.

In light of the presence in the world of these wonderful people, and I certainly include with them my friends and community leaders from the many other faiths and spiritualities that I have been blessed to know, we must guard our response to anti-Semitic attacks. Besides the fact that we now, sadly, share the target realm with Muslims, Sikhs and many others, we must not let the actions and attitudes of what is still a small minority provoke disabling and isolating fear.

Anti-Semites, like all bigots and the despots they admire and follow, want us to retreat into tribalism. As New York Times columnist, David Brooks, writes in his work "The Second Mountain": "The world is in the midst of one of those transition moments. The individualistic moral ecology is crumbling around us. It has left people naked and alone. For many, the first instinctive reaction is the evolutionary one: Revert to tribe. If we as a society respond to the excesses of "I'm Free to Be Myself" with an era of "Revert to Tribe," then the twenty-first century will be a time of conflict and violence that will make the twentieth look like child's play."

We must resist the urge to retreat and instead be bold and walk forward, hand in hand with our friends from many spiritualities, and

build a future worthy for our descendants to inherit.

One of the goals here at the Beth Shir Shalom ECC is to give our children skills that will carry on and grow throughout their lifetime. Some of the skills are academically inclined. We ensure that our children will have the opportunity to engage in activities that will help them succeed in school. We also guide children to be autonomous, being able to wait for their turn and be selfsufficient. We provide an environment for children to socialize and model ways to talk to each other. Our children learn to self regulate, to solve problems with their peers, and to engage with others before seeking help from an adult. These skills will help them move forward in life and will continue to develop as the child grows.

But the most important goal we have as educators is to help an egocentric young child progress on the path to becoming a mensch. Not an easy task as children are born in survival mode and being egocentric enables them to be taken care of. As they grow, we guide them to realize they are not the center of the universe. Again, this is not an easy accomplishment. We encourage children to listen and respond in kind. We want them to be truthful, yet know when not to be too forward. These are social skills that are learned by doing. It is a simple task for a parent to model, at least in theory. To educate a mensch has many facets to it. We must reflect the behavior we want to see in our child. Helping others, doing the right thing, striving to be a better person. These are all great qualities. Yet do we carry these traits out daily, weekly or even monthly? Are we respectful and kind to others and show thoughtfulness and everyday kindness to strangers? Do we speak of others with respect, or disdain? A simple please and thank you to a server or cashier goes a long way in the education of respect to your child. We must show our children that entitlement is not powerful, it is powerless. To begin with respect for others is the foundation for a mensch in the making. From here, we build the leaders of our community.
